*Most of the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA) resources make use of the English Standard Version (ESV). The ESV is a reliable, faithful, and updated English translation of the original languages and this is our standard translation. Anglicans have a long tradition of loving Holy Scripture. In the 14th century Anglican scholar John Wycliffe translated the Bible into English. Since then, countless English translations have been made including the King James Version (KJV), translated by Anglicans in 1611 and it's still used today!*
